of the Pennsylvania Line, and that he continued in
the service until the war ended

I further declare that I have never received a warrant
for the Bounty Land promised to said Philip Klinger
in the part of the united states; nor do I believe that he
ever received it, or transferred his claim to it in any
manner whatsoever; therefore know all men by these
presents, that I Peter Klinger aforesaid do hereby
constitute and appoint vespasian Ellis of Accomack
County Virginia to be my true and lawful Attorney
for me and in my names to demand and receive
from the secretary of war of the united states a warrant
for the quantity of land due to me as aforesaid; and
my said attorney is hereby fully authorized and empow-
ered to constitute and appoint one, or more substitutes
or attorneys under him for the special purposes above
expressed Witness my hand & seal this 10th day of
June AD 1834
