

DALE CEMETERY

Salem Twp., Delaware Co.

Dale Cemetery is located in Daleville, Salem Township, Delaware County, Indiana, at the east end of Sorghum Street behind the home of Robert Smith, 102 Sorghum Street.

Buried here is the Revolutionary War soldier, Campbell Dale, who was born in Worcester County, Maryland, and served in the Maryland Militia under Captain John Brnard, Captain John Postley, Lieutenant Colonel William Fernel and Brigadier General BeShield. The Sons of the American Revolution placed a government marker on his grave in April of 1964.

On the 10th of November 1838, the town of Daleville was laid out and platted by Alexander Campbell Dale, better known as Campbell Dale. The small cemetery in Daleville was also named after him.

Campbell Dale's daughter, Hannah Rhoda Dale Leathers, is said to be buried here, although there is no marker. Possibly his wife Elizabeth is buried here also. However, there is some question as to whether she died before Campbell brought his family to Indiana.
