



THE UNITED BRETHREN CHURCH OF DALEVILLE, WAS FOUNDED IN 1809. GROUND WAS BROKEN FOR THIS BUILDING ON OCTOBER 21, 1922. IT'S LOCATION IS ON CORNER OF DALEVILLE ROAD & WALNUT STREET. THE CHURCH WAS VACATED IN 1970 FOR A MERGER WITH THE METHODIST CHURCH. IT THEN BECAME THE HOME OF THE DALEVILLE LIONS CLUB. AFTER THE DALEVILLE LIONS CLUB MOVED TO THEIR NEW BUILDING ON CORNER OF 6th & EDWARDS STREET. THE BUILDING WAS DEMOLISHED TO ADD SPACE FOR THE MASONIC LODGE.



Twenty-three people attended the ceremony last Sunday to open the metal box which was found in an old church building. Many of them recognized "old Daleville family names." The names of Daleville businessmen and teachers and several other documents were in the box.
