

It is strange how Indiana counties carry names out of the long ago and the people are proud of the ancestral names and of the names of towns and cities, as well as counties, named after great towns of the old world, as well as names dear to Americans. Some of the Madison county towns call to mind incidents in the history of Hamilton county. Going through Chesterfield, in Madison county, the seat of the Spiritualists of Indiana, recalls the great debate on Spiritualism at the great barn of **Jesse Foulke**, northwest of Deming, seventy-five or so years ago. Then, there's Yorktown, a fine place recalling what happened to Cornwallis in the days of Washington, Passing through Muncie, one soon reaches Albany which has done so much for Hamilton county, sending Rev. M. O. Lester and Rev. A. W. Pugh to Noblesville as pastors. And, Noblesville returned the compliment by making both of them district superintendents and starting them on the way to bishoprics.
