## Civil War Review

July 7, 1863 The 63rd Indiana Infantry and Battery "F" 1st Michigan Light Artillery met Confederate forces at Sherperdsville, Kentucky, losing 5 men missing. The 6th U.S. Cavalry lost 6 killed, 9 wounded and 50 missJuly 9, 1863 The 1st Battalion of California Mountaineers were attacked on Redwood Creek, California.

The Indiana Home Guard lost 2 killed, 2 wounded and 45 missing at Brandenburg, Kentucky when Gen. John H. Morgan's Raiders crossed the Ohio River into Indiana.

Port Hudson, Louisiana surrendered to Union forces under command of Gen. Bank's after a siege, thus giving the Union control of the Mississippi River, splitting the Confederacy. Losses by Union forces during the entire period of the siege were: 708 killed, 3,336 wounded and 319 missing.

Union Cavalry lost 3 killed, 17 wounded and 5 missing in fighting at Benevola or Beaver Creek, Maryland.
