

Death Of Mrs.

Mrs. Verne M. Foulke, 68, wife of Marvin Foulke, well known Hamilton County farmer and former County Commisisoner, passed away at the Witham Hospital in Lebanon early Saturday.

Although in poor health for some time, Mrs. Foulke was as well as usual until she was stricken suddenly Friday evening. Rushed to the hospital, she died soon after being admitted.

Funeral services will be held at 10:30 a. m. Tuesday at the West Grove Friends church with Rev. Paul Hicks officiating, assisted by Rev. Frank Stafford.
