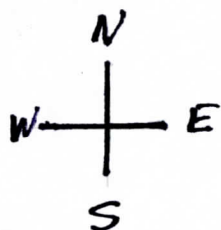

Tenant House, George Foulke Farm

- Kitchen:
 - South Door, Kitchen Door: [002] Jesse Foulke Testimony
 - East Door
- Bedroom:
 - Bed Set East and west with head to West [001] Dr. Moore testimony
 - Bed Center of room [001] Dr. A. R. Tucker testimony
 - Bed sat in corner, head to west [002] Moses Orbaugh testimony
 - Lounge head was north [002] Moses Orbaugh testimony
- East Door into Bedroom?
 - "Went to east door, Lucette told us to go around to the kitchen door" [002] Temple Marris testimony

He also stated that in the 1920s Mary Frances Underwood Foulke lived in the tenant house when her daughter Alice and her family ran the farm and lived in the big house. Again she lived in the tenant house when her daughter Grace and her family ran the farm and lived in the big house.
