*Sure Way to Keep Hen
Sitting Till Eggs Hatch*

Elwood, Ind., Aug. 18.—On Thursday, August 4, the thrashing machine went to the farm of Walter O. Mays, living three and one-quarter miles north of Elwood, and in making the straw stack an old hen setting on seven eggs was covered up in a fence corner. The straw stack was baled Aug 16, and the hen was uncovered after twelve days of imprisonment. She was still alive and was little the worse for her experience, and was the proud mother of five new little chicks. Farmers wives who have trouble in keeping the hens on their nest, long enough to hatch would do well to remember this as it seems to be a sure way to keep a hen setting till the eggs hatch.
